2. Describe life for Job in his current state.
3. How does Job justify his complaints?

 *Is life fair? Are we justified in complaining about it?*

IV. Job's Complaints Toward God & His Friends, 7:12-21

1. How have Job's friends treated him thus far? What does he want them to do?
2. What does Job want to know from God?

 *Why is God so concerned about man?*
